Judge Winchester:

I am writing to inquire about the status of my mother, Pauline Williams, financial situation since Pam Dirnberger was appointed her guardian/conservator. While our mother, Pauline, was in our care for the period of approximately a year and a half her bills were being paid as they came due and she had no outstanding debts that were not being paid. It seems that as of now she has quite a few bills that are not being paid. I would like to know if the businesses and agencies she owes are aware that Ms. Dirnberger is not paying her bills and would also like to know if she intends to ever pay these bills?

These are the bills that I know about. I don't know if this is all inclusive for what my mother owes.

- 1) There is a bill that is increasing each month to Sterling Pharmacy. The monthly amount may possibly be around \$400, but I am not exactly sure of the amount. Is Ms. Dirnberger planning to pay this bill?
- 2) According to paperwork from your court, she now owes in excess of \$23,000 to the Convalescent Center. Is Ms. Dirnberger planning to pay this bill?
- 3) The Board of Municipal Utilities in the amount of \$281.04. Is Ms. Dirnberger planning to pay this bill? I also understand that the utilities in my mother's home were shut off by Ms. Dirnberger. Therefore, the house is sitting in a state of disrepair since Ms. Dirnberger was appointed and stopped maintaining the home. I am attaching the two letters I sent to Ms. Dirnberger about my concerns. I believe the house will be a burden to the taxpayer's of Missouri due to possibly being condemned and needing to be torn down.
- 4) A current tax bill for Scott County for her home and handicapped vehicle, which was repossessed after Ms. Dirnberger took over my mother's financial affairs in the amount of \$209.32 and will continue to accrue daily. Is Ms. Dirnberger planning to pay that bill? Or is a lien being placed on my mother's home as that bill is now overdue?
- 5) A bill for taxes for the city of Sikeston in the amount of \$11.86, which is also now past due. Is Ms. Dirnberger planning to pay that bill?
- 6) A bill to Liberty Utilities in the amount of \$159.23. Is Ms. Dirnberger planning to pay that bill?
- 7) A bill to St. Francis Medical Center in the amount of \$224.40. Is Ms. Dirnberger planning to pay that bill?
- 8) My mother also had homeowner's insurance on her home and lake property which Ms. Dirnberger let lapse for non-payment. So both of my mother's properties are currently uninsured. As stated in the attached letter, my mother's home has been broken into and vandalized on several occasions. I suppose there is no recourse as it is currently uninsured?
- 9) I am also aware of notification by the city of Sikeston that the lawn was not maintained and mowed. Is there now a fine owed to the city or payment for them taking responsibility to mow the lawn? Is Ms. Dirnberger taking care of my mother's lawn or is she allowing the city to take care of it? If the city is taking care of it, are they being paid and if not, are they aware they will not be paid?

10) Obviously, due to the lawyers and court now being involved in my mother's life are those bills continuing to increase and are they going to be paid by Ms. Dirnberger?

11) And lastly, due to my mother's recent admission to the hospital I am certain there will be a bill due to Missouri Delta Hospital. I have no idea how much that will total, but given the length of her stay it will most likely be substantial. Is Ms. Dirnberger planning to pay that bill?

So in summary, are the citizens of Scott County and the state of Missouri aware that if placed in guardianship and conservatorship of Ms. Dirnberger their bills may not be paid? Also are the businesses in Sikeston aware of the money they will be out due to non-payment by Ms. Dirnberger? Are they also aware that Ms. Dirnberger doesn't get involved in specifics?

Almost nine months have passed since my mother was placed in Ms. Dirnberger's "care". I have spent that nine months trying to figure out how my mother is better off. She spends her days sitting in a chair staring at the wall in the nursing home. She had two bedsores. When I asked Ms. Dirnberger what the nursing home was doing to treat those bedsores, her response was and I quote "I do not get involved in specifics of treatment". At 85 years old, she has more debt than she has ever had in her entire life and which may never be paid.

I have to wonder why she was taken from the care of her three daughters for no good reason and placed in the "care" of someone who clearly isn't "caring" for her or her finances and property.

Dear Judge Winchester;

The main reason Mrs. Williams has outstanding bills is because her family, Teala Mainzer, Rebecca Adams and Ramona Burnett, were, and still are, very uncooperative when I asked them about Mrs. Williams finances. They have not turned over any money to me at all. I am just now being appointed her fiduciary by the VA. Her VA pension has been going somewhere else since the conservatorship was appointed. And, yes, she does owe Sikeston Convalescent Center over \$23,000.00 which is her VA pension that I do not have. The pharmacy bill that was mentioned was paid in September. She will not qualify for Medicaid as long as she still owns real estate. The real estate hearing is also scheduled for January 27th. Hopefully we can sell those properties for a decent price. I do wonder why, if they were receiving bills, especially taxes, they did not forward them to me. It seems like they intended for the taxes to be over due. I cannot pay bills without money.

I cannot maintain property without money. A friend of mine did clean up the yard a couple of times as a favor to me but I cannot expect him to do that forever. If they are so worried about the property, why didn't didn't Rick Burnett maintain it since he is in Sikeston. Carla Williams told me the yard didn't look any worse that it did when Rick was supposedly maintaining it before.

I did not "let her homeowners insurance lapse" because no one gave me any information about it. I'm sure it did lapse because I had no idea about it. Again, if they were getting the bills why did they not send them to me. I think this was deliberate.

When Mrs. Williams was admitted to Missouri Delta Medical Center recently, she had pneumonia. She did not have bedsores when she went in. When Teala asked me what they were doing for those sores, I responded that they were following standard protocol prescribed by her doctor. She asked me what was and I responded that I was not a medical person and I did not know exactly and that I usually do not get into specifics of treatment if they are following the doctors' orders. That quote was sort of out of context.

Whenever anyone goes into a skilled nursing home, as Mrs. Williams did, unless they have a lot of money and can pay 100% of the care bills there, it takes ***ALL of their income each and every month***, therefore there is always the possibility that other bills cannot be paid.

I have not done anything that I should not have done, nor have I done anything that I did not feel was in Mrs. Williams best interests.
